We wanted to provide a visual experience for our pupils, parents and partners that clearly articulated our curriculum vision to all.

Like our Vision Tree roots are rooted in our School Vision statement and our Esk Valley Vision Statement. The roots depict our intent for our broad and balanced curriculum - a clear and ambitious vision for providing a high quality inclusive education to all of our children.

Our chosen bible text, 'I have come that they might have life and have it to the full', shares our firm belief that education is about the whole child and equipping them to live a happy and successful life.

The trunk of a tree provides strength and stability. We gain this through our collaboration, and ambition for shared subject leadership, across a number of small Esk Valley Schools. A core of our provision is the National Curriculum which provides pupils with an introduction to the essential knowledge that they need to be educated citizens. Our community links and support with our visits and visitors is also key and helps us to personalise learning to our children's needs and interests.

The trunk is surrounded by the vine of Mental Health and Well-being and Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural, British Values, Enterprise and Outdoor Learning. These are themes that we believe should be entwined through all that we do.

In the impact canopy each branch colour matches each root with a statement which we believe outlines our self-evaluation of our work in our school family.

The children's words are in the acorns. These are words that they believe are important in our school.
