# Handwashing and Sanitising

Thank you to those of you who have alerted us to the fact that the children are starting to get sore hands from the additional handwashing they are doing at school. We are using a mild moisturising handwash and we have approximately three additional hand washes through the day on top of the children's usual toilet and lunchtime handwashing routine - depending on activities. We have talked to the children about the importance of rinsing the soap off properly and drying their hands properly which we think are the main contributing factors to those getting sore hands. We will be reinforcing the importance of doing this in school but would appreciate it if you could also have that conversation with your child. Thank you.

We have been advised by our NYCC Health and Safety advisor that children should not bring their own hand sanitiser or liquids into school. Hand sanitiser is not used by the children in school unless we are in a circumstance such as Forest School, where we have no access to soap and water. It is also a requirement that we hold the COSHH safety data sheet for every different liquid in school.

If your child is having significant issues due to a skin condition, please complete the Medication Form from our website to allow us to administer any necessary medication. The form can be found <u>HERE</u>.

### Bringing items into school

Due to the current Covid-19 situation and as per our parent guidance sheet, we are trying to limit the amount of items transferred between home and school. Therefore we ask that items such as birthday cakes are not sent into school without prior discussion with the Headteacher. Any such items will need to be quarantined for 72 hours in school before we can share them with the children. We are unable to share homemade cakes with the children at the moment. Thank you.

#### Bag2School

We are pleased to announce that the Friends of Egton School, has organised a clothes & shoe collection with Bag2School in order to raise funds for the school. This collection will take place on **Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> November**. As we are unable to currently store the bags in school they will need to be brought to school before 9am on the morning of the 11<sup>th</sup> November. Please make sure that the bags are sealed and left in the front garden. Thank you.

Bag2School is the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 2001 it has now paid out over £36 million.

As well as raising vitally needed funds for Egton School PTFA, it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. A recent DEFRA report has shown that textile collection schemes are helping to reduce the volume of textiles discarded as municipal solid waste. However it is a fact that as a nation we still send 350,000 tonnes of textiles to landfill every year.

By getting involved in our Bag2School collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles in the bag provided – this can include adults' and children's clothes, shoes (tied together please), hats, belts, handbags and soft toys (see below list). In addition to raising much needed funds it will also raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.

We will be sending home a donation bag in due course but if you fill the donation bag and still have more, then you can use any other bag to donate your items and don't forget to ask grandparents, friends and neighbours to have a sort out as well!

Please observe social distancing rules when dropping off your bags.

Bag2School collect the following 'good quality' items for RE-USE (Any unsuitable items will be refused)

- Men's, Ladies' and Children's clothing
- Paired shoes (tied together or elastic band around)
- Handbags
- Hats
- Bags
- Scarves and ties
- Jewellery
- Lingerie
- Socks
- Belts
- Soft toys

• Household linen, curtains, towels, bedding (bed sheets, pillow cases and duvet covers)

The following items WILL NOT be accepted:

- Duvets and blankets
- Pillows and cushions
- Carpets, rugs and mats (including bath, shower and toilet mats)
- Soiled, painted, ripped or wet clothing
- School uniforms with and without logo
- Corporate clothing and workwear
- Textile off cuts, yarns or threaded material

In the event of inclement weather please protect your Bag2School bags by making sure they are tied up securely and water tight. Thank you.
