Opportunities for Teaching Diversity, Equality and Expanding Cultural Capital

- Show that Jesus welcomed all people - even those who were disliked or different.
- Highlight that Christianity is a **global faith**, practised by people of many races and cultures.
- Use stories, pictures and videos of diverse Christian communities around the world.
- Teach that everyone is valued, no matter their background or mistakes.
- Explore Jesus' message of **forgiveness** and **second chances**.
- Discuss fairness, kindness, and treating others with respect
- Visit a local church and learn how it supports the community.
- Discover real Christian projects like **St George's Crypt** helping the homeless.
- Use **drama**, **art**, and **storytelling** to bring ideas like peace and forgiveness to life.

Key Knowledge

Jesus brings good news to everyone

Christians believe that Jesus came to bring good news to the world. His good news wasn't just about being happy - it was about helping people feel loved, forgiven, peaceful, and close to God. Christians believe that Jesus showed people how to live in a kind and loving way.

Jesus chose people to help him - even surprising ones!

Jesus had 12 special friends called disciples. He didn't choose rich or powerful people. He chose ordinary people - even some that others didn't like, like Matthew the tax collector. Christians believe this shows that Jesus sees the good in everyone, and anyone can follow him.

Jesus taught about forgiveness

Jesus told people that it's important to say sorry when they do something wrong and to forgive others too. Christians believe Jesus taught that God forgives people who are truly sorry. Saying sorry and forgiving others can help people feel better and start again.

Jesus brings peace to people's hearts

Jesus said, "My peace I give to you." Christians believe Jesus helps people feel calm inside - even when life is hard. They believe he brings peace in their hearts, peace with other people, and peace with God. Christians often pray when they feel worried or scared.

Christians try to follow Jesus' example

Christians believe that Jesus showed people how to love others. That means helping those who are poor, lonely, or sad. Christians try to follow Jesus by being kind, caring, and generous - just like he was.

Church is a place to find peace, friendship and forgiveness

Christians go to church to pray, sing, say sorry to God, and be with others. Church can be a peaceful place to think and talk to God. Christians believe the church is part of Jesus' good news - a place where people can feel welcomed, forgiven and loved.
