

Our Vision Explained



We wanted to provide a visual experience for our pupils, parents and partners that clearly articulated our Christian vision to all.

Our Vision tree is an oak tree from the old English proverb - 'Mighty Oaks from little acorns grow'

The roots are rooted in our Vision statement. This is nourished by the bible text over the soil. The roots depict the seven strands of the current church school's inspection framework which guides our work in school.

Our chosen bible text, 'I have come that they might have life and have it to the full', shares our firm belief that education is about the whole child and equipping them to live a happy and successful life.

The trunk of a tree provides strength and stability. We gain this through our three core values of Trust, Friendship and Respect. The trunk is surrounded by the vine of Mental Health and Well-being and Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural education. These are themes that we believe should be entwined through all that we do.

Our seedlings show that we promote diversity and equality through the school and our use of the rainbow colours depict our respect for LGBTQ Communities and other minority groups.

In the impact canopy each branch colour matches each root with a statement which we believe outlines our self-evaluation of our work in our school family.

The children's words are in the acorns. These are words that they believe are important in our school.

Our hands show our belief that all the areas on our tree go 'hand on hand'.
